



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Best practices

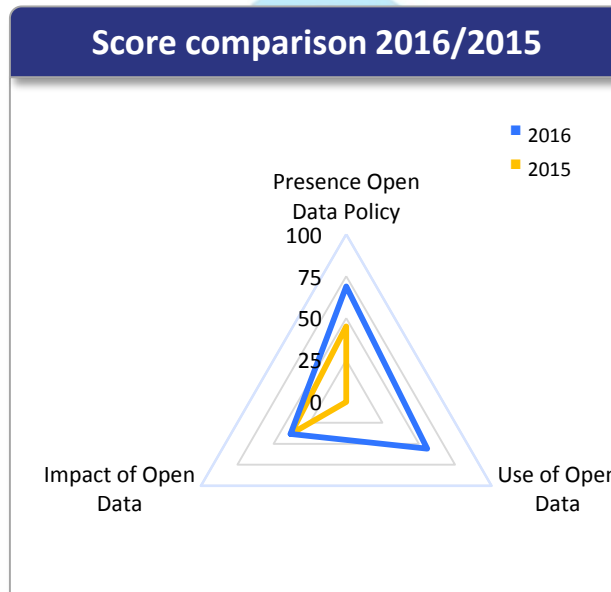
- Supervisor:** online application that provides information to users on business transactions of the public sector bodies. One minister resigned, because the money she earned next to her salary was shown.
- Geopedia portal:** all spatial data put together in one place. It currently contains over 2000 different publicly accessible spatial layers.

Progress on barriers

- The financial barrier for further publication will be addressed by educating those public officials who plan new information systems and registers so that they include the Open Data to be in the systems by default, from the very beginning (an essential part of every project that involves data).
- The technical barrier for further use is addressed by the renewal of the national portal.



- ### Major changes 2016
- The score for Use of Open Data has increased because this year more information is known about the visitors of the portal for example the amount of visitors.
 - The major change is the transposition of the revised PSI Directive resulting in an increase in Presence Open Data Policy.
 - The score for Impact of Open Data has stayed the same compared to 2015.

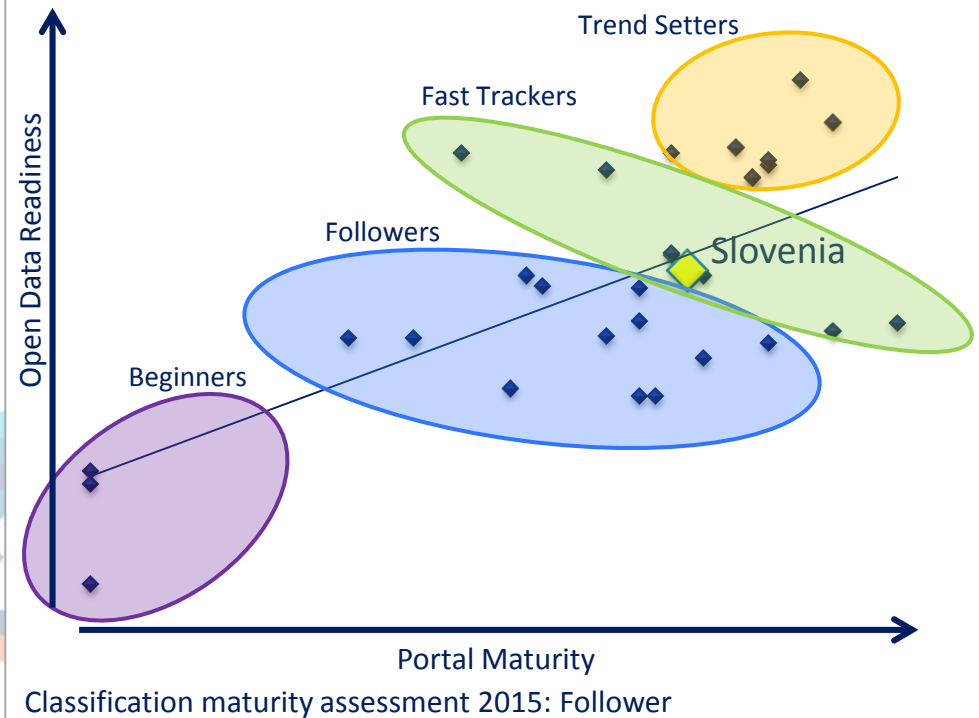
